ORDINANCE NO. 17 - 2013

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF TRAX CONSTRUCTION COMPANY FOR WATER LINE INSTALLATION FOR THE STATE ROUTE 528 SOUTHERLY WATER LINE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT, PHASE 1 (PART A), AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND FISCAL OFFICER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH SAME, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to prior Ordinance advertisement for bids for water line construction related to the State Route 528 Southerly Water Line Project, Phase 1(Part A), occurred; and

WHEREAS, said bids were publicly opened and read on March 26, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the bid of Trax Construction Company in the amount of Four Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand, Nine Hundred and Twenty-Eight Dollars (\$499,928.00) was the lowest responsible bid and, further, was in compliance with all legal requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF MADISON, LAKE COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the bid of Trax Construction Company is hereby accepted for Project Phase 1.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor and Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized to forthwith enter into a contract with Trax Construction Company in accordance with the specifications of the Village Engineer and the bid of Trax Construction Company for the Project Phase 1.

SECTION 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

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SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of Madison, because repairs must be made forthwith so as to protect the water supply to the Project area, and for the further reason that the Project is necessary to provide water service to a Madison Fire District station now under construction in the Project area; wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and immediately upon passage.
